Encouraged parents to watch Mrs. McNeil's last Parent Night video; Covid consciousness is going well at Maple Hill. Had 100% attendance in her class this week. District gave teachers KN95 masks. Kids are wearing masks at recess and indoors &amp; cleaning staff is constantly sanitizing; Progress Reports already have been sent out; February 11 is the end of the 2nd semester &amp; we are now administering district assessments; Kids are graduating from the EL Program; Miss Chavez is leaving. She is always with all the kids. Please let your kids know so they can thank her &amp; say goodbye; Teachers are hoping the school board approves next year's school hours within the next couple of months; Big thank you to office workers/secretaries for all their hard work as they have taken on so many extra duties and are so busy, so if you make contact with any of them please feel free to say thank you; Teachers are planning Valentine's parties; MHCC Board members who sent pics on time to Mrs. Cahallan will have them in the yearbook.</p>
<p>Treasurer's Report Nicole Smith</p>	<p>Presented Balance Sheet and Profit &amp; Loss Statement. MHCC will support Valentine's Day &amp; Jump Rope for Heart. Same usual expenses. Board &amp; Mrs. McNeil discussed funds earmarked for technology. Current Chromebooks are not up to date so new Chromebooks will be purchased for grades 3-5, while lower grades can use current Chromebooks for other means; Thank you to Julie who was able to secure a Walmart grant for \$1500; As Covid subsides this Spring we are hoping to host a movie night under the stars, socially distanced. We will be purchasing a projector and inflatable screen to keep for future years. Thank you families for all your support. Looking at Hawk Walk in March. Planning for how we can keep it safe. Stay tuned for info to come; Recycling has earned \$530 so far for the year. Our goal is \$1000. <p>1st V.P.'s Report Patti Beltran</p>	<p>Our schools are doing everything to keep kids safe. Please continue to read Mrs. McNeil's very helpful emails. Rapid Test pickup was last Saturday. If you missed it call the district to pick up your child's test; Early start Bill will be addressed by Mrs. McNeil; Enrollment for TK dates have changed so more students will be able to take advantage of this opportunity than in previous years. <p>2nd VP's Report Julie Lagos</p>	<p>Thank you to all families who participated in the Yogurtland competition. We won 1st Place &amp; a cash award of \$300; Skate Night is scheduled for February 17. MHCC Board &amp; Mrs. McNeil are discussing with the district to get a concrete answer if it will be allowed in light of ever-changing Covid protocols. Mrs. McNeil will send out an update; If your child earned a Skate Night ticket from the Fall Fundraiser &amp; Skate night gets cancelled they will get a movie night ticket instead; Will update when we can on future Family Night's Out as many restaurants are not willing to host fundraisers because of employee shortages; The \$1500 Walmart grant will be used to purchase an outdoor movie projector and screen.</p>

<p>Announcements General Questions</p>	<p>Early Start Bill arrived prior to Covid and has since been passed. It states that beginning with the school year 2022-2023 high schools cannot begin prior to 8:30 am &amp; middle schools prior to 8:00 am. The district is still determining all school start times. The goal is for the least amount of drastic change. They have to coordinate between three levels of schools &amp; with district transportation. They are currently looking at all scenarios. If this can be achieved in the next month or two it will give leave about 6 months to plan our school schedules. We will move forward when we get more info; TK will be for children who were born September 2, 2017 - February 28, 2018. It is for children turning 5 years old between September 2 - February 28, 2023. Check out the district website for more info; Nancy Park to share info with MHCC board members regarding vendors/ wholesale products for movie night; In response to a question about a covid vaccine mandate, Mrs. McNeil stated that there is no talk about a mandate as that would only come from the government.</p>
